God's Perfect Plan

Nothing makes it feel more like Christmas than listening to Christmas music. We like to start early to enjoy the magic of Christmas for as long as possible. We were having a conversation about our top ten Christmas carols while listening to *Mary Did You Know*, which sparked an interesting comment from my teenagers.

"If Mary said she was pregnant as a virgin today, nobody would believe her."

My immediate answer was "people didn't believe her back then either."

It's easy to lose perspective. We believe in the Bible without question. We don't stop to think about why God did many things... or if we do, we look at the big picture but not the details. We recognize the significance of Jesus being born of the Virgin Mary but we don't take time to think of Mary, a pregnant teenager, not yet married, barely old enough to understand the significance of having a child, let alone the son of God, who was sent to save us all.

We don't know much about Mary. We don't know if she tried to hide her pregnancy, we don't know about the reaction of her parents or friends. We know the details that God chose to share with us. We know that after an angel visited both Mary and Joseph, they had faith in God.

God could have chosen a noble family, a family with means. He could have chosen an older woman, a righteous woman who could properly care for an infant. He could have chosen an experienced mother, a woman who had been widowed, he could have chosen anyone. He could have chosen a woman like Sarah, who was too old to give birth to a baby. But he chose Mary, a girl, maybe 14 years old, who had no idea that she was being given the most important job in the history of all mankind. She was being tasked with giving birth to the most fragile tiny Lord of All. She was responsible to keep baby Jesus safe and alive.

It was not uncommon for young girls to be married and start families as teenagers. But surely those births were risky, for mother and child. Surely without proper medical care, those young mothers faced daunting odds. And if that's not scary enough, add in a nice long donkey ride from Nazareth to Bethlehem... four long days of traveling in what had to be uncomfortable, to say the least.

Why are these details significant? Why does it matter that our Lord and Savior was born in a stable, not in a medical facility or even a proper home? In those days, home births were common and midwives often helped with those births... but surely most babies were not born in a stable, laid in a manger meant to feed the farm animals. And why was Jesus born in Bethlehem, a small insignificant town?

Why did God choose a poor young couple of no means, to birth Jesus in the most insignificant place, in the most humble birth imaginable. I'm not sure that Hollywood could have scripted a better rags to riches story... There was no silver spoon, Jesus was the ultimate underdog.

God's Perfect Plan Continued...

The Bible doesn't breakdown the choices behind the story of Jesus's birth. We know that God, is a God of wisdom. When the miracles of Jesus are doubted (later in life), Jesus chooses to wait several days to raise Lazarus from the dead. In fact, he waits until after Lazarus is buried. There was no question that Lazarus was dead, not close to dead, all the way dead.

It seems as though the story of Jesus's birth has a similar theme. Jesus had no advantages. In fact, he had every disadvantage. No one could claim that he was blessed by noble birth or privileged in life. While much of his life is not recorded in the Bible, it is known that he worked as a carpenter, or more likely a laborer like his father. He did not have an easy path.

It is easy to romanticize the Christmas story. Even as Christians, we sing carols, we bake cookies, we set up nativities and decorate with festive lights. We remember that Jesus is the Reason for the Season. But do we see a scared teenager, who traveled for days by donkey, to give birth in the area where animals are kept? Do we recognize that much of the world didn't believe her or just didn't care... there was no fanfare. Sure, Mary is famous now, but back then she was just a teenager being dealt a difficult hand, with possibly the most significant job in history. If she had failed at her job, the fate of the world would be much different. Her faith in God and her success as Jesus's mother give us eternal hope.

How big is our God that he trusted a fearfully, wonderfully made teenager with the fate of humanity? For those of us who like to worry about all the things that could go wrong, this story is full of reasons to worry. But God's plan is perfect, even when it seems scary. God has made us all for a purpose and he knows that we are up to the challenge. It is easy to allow fear to speak more loudly than faith. It's easy to think that our challenges are more significant, our fears are more founded. But next time we are struggling to trust God, think back to the scared teenager who trusted a plan that only God could pull off. Don't think of all the things that you can't do, instead remember that there is nothing that God can't do.

Welcome: Reverend Gaden, declaring a quorum, welcomed all to the October 21, 2024 Session Business Meeting and opened in prayer.

7:00 PM-Devotion, Karen Thatcher

Karen spoke about Joel and what has been going on in his life the past few months. Process in the mind, prayer and worry are together. Karen read from *Psalm 39:12-13* and how God knew us before we were thought of or born.

He gave us abilities, and that God has a plan for all of us. Jesus answers the crying people's hearts, even if they are empty. When feeling overwhelmed, God's love gives us hope. There is a thirst out there and those are looking to the church to what we do and say. We as a church should always pray for those that need us. Amen.

Moderator Time - Pastor Linda Gaden

All went around the room and shared their concerns.

Clerks Correspondence and Session Mail Box - Susan McCloughan

Review of Minutes: A **motion** was called to approve the Annual Report Minutes from February 26, 2024. All were in favor. Another motion was called to approve the minutes from September 23, 2024. All were in favor.

Mail Box/Clerk Correspondence- Lisa B. from the Hunterdon County Dept. of Public Health inspected the church kitchen on 10/9/24, and we have received the Satisfactory Certificate. We have received the Inspection

Certificate and the Certificate of Registration from the City of Lambertville Fire Prevention, and both will be posted in the gym. The picture arrived from Ginny Pickles regarding Mary Mac Kubbin and it was shared at the meeting. A description of the picture will go with it, when it is hung in the church. Steve Emery did come out and tune the organ on 10/17. He did report issues with it, but these will be addressed once the church roof is completed. The LBL will be using the gym for their games from Monday December 2, 2024 through Saturday March 15, 2025. Jim Troutman has sent in the Facility Use Agreement.

There was a husband and wife who were from Israel walking by the church and saw the poster "Remembering October 7", he thanked our church for having the service on October 6th to remember October 7th, and for our prayers.

Clerk of Session Workshop October 2024- This was a Zoom meeting held by the Presbytery. Many items were discussed-some examples were: The General Assembly of the Presbytery that met in June-July 2024. Kate Trigger-Duffert (GA Planner) spoke about the meeting and there were some changes to the Book of Order. When they are available, we will get the information from our Stated Clerk, Steve Shussett. During the meeting, Boundary Training and Anti-Racism Policy were discussed. I was able to print those handouts, and they were given out during the Session Meeting. More to follow on the new policies. They also spoke about Background Checks for those who work with children in the church.

Discernment Process- The Session is continuing to review the "Turn the Page" documents that were handed out previously in regards to looking for a new Pastor. Session discussed the possible dates of 11/25/24, 1/13 & 1/27/25 to meet with Jeanne Radak our Presbytery Leader, and Mt. Airy. Sue will reach out to Jeanne with the dates and ask that she contact Mt. Airy and get back to me on which dates will work.

Calendar Highlights from November 2024-January 2025

Communion is scheduled on Veterans' Sunday Nov. 3, with Pastor Gregory. Mt. Airy will be joining us. The information will be in the bulletins for who is scheduled to give the upcoming Sermons and our Accompanists. The Ladies' Bible Study will be continuing on Wednesdays. The Session Prayer Meetings will take place on Nov. 4, Dec. 2, and January 6. Spanish Ministry will be continuing to meet at our church on Sundays at 3:00 pm. Riverside Symphonia are here for concerts on Nov. 2nd and December 7th. The Bell Choir is starting back on 11/7. Skating for the Youth starts on Friday Nov. 22nd. The Lambertville Elks is holding their Hoop Shoot in the gym on Sat. 12/7. The Ladies' Christmas Gathering is Monday 12/9 at 6:30 pm. Children's Christmas Pageant is Sunday 12/15, Jen Chernoski will be organizing the pageant. On 12/24 Christmas Eve, the Service is at 4:00 pm and will also include the Candlelight Service. The Annual Reports are due to the Church Office starting the week of January 6th.

Worship and Music/Church Life – Joanne DiBlasi/Karen Thatcher

Insurance Review- We have received our Certificate of Liability Insurance from the CRISP Agency (formally the Duryea Agency), and Karen discussed it with Session. The certificate is on file in the Church Office.

Young Adult Time- This is happening when there are young adults at the church service.

Accompanist/Music Director- Lucia will discuss with Karen what the Music Director job entails. Sue will be continuing to direct the Bell Choir. Adri B. has accepted a position with another church. Thank you to Stephen, George, Ariana, Hilary and Lucia for being our regular accompanists. Karen would also like the Music Director to work with the children in the pageant. Also, for Stephen more involved in playing for the Children's Sunday School.

Spanish Ministry- Joanne spoke about this and the Spanish Ministry is meeting here on Sundays at 3:00 pm. More people have been attending. Francesca would like to be here on Halloween evening to have her group pray.

Joint Services- Three churches participated in the July Joint Communion Service at Holcombe-Jimison. Pastor Gregory expressed that he will not be able to participate next year.

Building and Grounds - Pat Durborow/Phil McCloughan/Don Pidcock

The **new technology** for the Livestream is working, but Sue will need to get in touch with Comcast to find out if we will need another router in the Sanctuary, because the service has been spotty. Phil asked if Stephen would be able to put our bulletin up on the Livestream so it is there during the service.

Church Organ- Discussed earlier. The organ will look to be repaired after the church roof is completed.

Church Roof- Phil met with Rainmaster, but we will need to give them a deposit before the work gets started. He will check with Rainmaster to see on getting the necessary permits. We will also need snow guards on the roof. Phil did let Eiseman Roofing know that we were going with another company, and he thanked them for their time. We will be getting a metal roof and we will updating our gutter system. More details to come.

Skating- Was discussed earlier.

Martinez Landscaping- Pat received the estimate from Martinez and he gave us a price of restoning of the wall at the end of the gym. The wall is falling over at this point. The estimate is \$5331.00. A **motion** was called to replace the wall. All were in favor.

Hallway in Church/Bathrooms/Front Door Issues- The church hallway and bathrooms were not discussed tonight. Addie scraped and primed above the outside front doors. LaNelle will redo the church sign hanging above the front doors in the spring. Phil talked about draining the pipes on the kitchen side of the building, so they don't freeze.

Church Heaters/Monthly Fire Inspections- The heaters are going to be serviced by Garden State sometime around October 24th. Don has been doing the monthly checks on the smoke detectors and Exit Signs.

Pastor Search Committee- Karen and Sue will meet to go through the application for Princeton Seminary, it will be completed and sent to Session before sending the application into Princeton.

Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of the Highlands- Phil would like to attend the following Zoom workshops for the Presbytery: 11/2-Financial Workshop, 11/4- Anti-Racism, 11/7-Creating a Culture of Change and 11/12- The Stated Presbytery Meeting. He would like to see in which direction that our Presbytery is going.

Budget and Finance - Don Pidcock

The Year-to-Date Summary- Wasn't discussed this evening.

Lowell Hunter Estate and Per Capita- Were not discussed.

Church Giving- Don expressed an interest in the church getting either Venmo or a QR Code so that we can receive monetary donations. It was mentioned that we already have online giving with Subsplash, and is on the Church Website. More information to follow.

Boy Scouts- Don spoke with Porter Little from the Boy Scouts and he will meet with him tomorrow night, 10/22.

Dominican Republic Mission Trip- Don and members of our church along with Crystal and Chuck and members of their church will be leaving for the DR on 10/26 and returning on 11/2. We have received a lot of donations for the trip. Don thanked us for all the donations and for our prayers.
