Julia- Thank you to my church family for the scholarship to support my future goals. I am attending West Chester University for Marketing. My plan is to work in social media marketing, hopefully for a sports organization. Thanks again for supporting me as I start my college journey!

Dillon— Ever since I laid my first weld a couple of years ago, I knew that welding was something I wanted to do as a career. I practice welding and experiment with the tools four to five days a week, or whenever I'm free to improve my skills. My passion for welding inspired me to enroll in the program at Penn College of Technology in Williamsport, PA, for the fall of 2024, after I graduate from South Hunterdon. I intend to earn a bachelor's degree in Welding and Fabrication Engineering Technology at Penn College, while also playing on the college baseball team.

Over the past two years, I've had the opportunities to use my welding skills to create useful items for friends and family. For example, I've made rock sliders and bumpers for my friend's truck, and I've repaired metal tools and items for my uncle, who is a builder, and my grandfather who is a handyman.
