Step 1– God's Purpose: Peace and Life

God loves you and wants you to experience peace and eternal life-abundant and eternal.

The Bible says: "We have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Romans 5:1

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16

"I [Jesus] came that they may have life and have it abundantly." John 10:10

Why don't most people have this peace and abundant life that God planned for us to have?

Step 2– The Problem: Sin Separates Us

Step 3– God's Remedy: The Cross

VA Expands Burial Benefits for Veterans

Starting in October of last year, the VA raised the burial plot allowance for veterans who qualify. The new benefit covers the cost or transportation expense of the Veteran to any National veterans cemetery. The VA also encourages families to plan ahead for the interment of their veteran family members. You cannot 'reserve' a specific spot or place in any veterans cemetery, but you can pre register for benefits at the time of death at *http://www.va.gov/plan-ahead*. From there you can review all end of life benefits which you may have been entitled. Any spouse of any deceased veteran is also entitled to burial in the same space or plot as their loved one.

Arlington National Cemetery is operated by the US Army and has different rules than the VA. Normally, one must be a retired veteran receiving retirement pay, and or have received combat related medal Purple Heart and above, or a war service medal or combat action awards.





Welcome: Reverend Gaden, declaring a quorum, welcomed all to the April 15, 2024 Session Business Meeting and opened in prayer.

Clerks Correspondence and Session Mail Box - Susan McCloughan

Review of Minutes: A motion was called to approve the minutes from March 18, 2024. All were in favor.

Mail Box/Clerk Correspondence- A post card was received from Bob Heath and the Gideons and they will be praying for our church on 4/27. Handouts from the Presbytery were given: *Your Appointed Moderator* and *Turn the Page*. Session was asked to review both and that the *Turn the Page* handout should be revisited as soon as possible. That handout is the process for finding a new Pastor. The Inspection Report from the Boilers and Fire Inspections were received. There were issues with one of the furnaces and Phil and Heather will take care of getting this issue fixed. Stephen M. asked if we can have Steve Emery come to tune the organ soon. Sue will reach out to Steve to see when he could come. The joint service at Holcombe-Jimison on July 7th is being coordinated by Karen Thatcher, Pat Masterson, and others. Pat will reach out to Mt. Airy and Titusville. Karen will go through her notes and reach out to Pastor Gregory, as well as Mary Lou from Holcombe-Jimison. More information to follow.

Calendar Highlights from May-July 2024

Communion is scheduled for 5/26, 6/2 will be a joint Communion Sunday with Mt. Airy at Mt. Airy and 7/7 at the joint service at Holcombe-Jimison. See the bulletins for who is scheduled to give the upcoming Sermons and our Accompanists. The Ladies' Bible Study will be continuing on Wednesdays throughout the summer. LPS is continuing with the use of our gym. On Thursday May 2nd is the National Day of Prayer. Our Sanctuary will be open for prayer. Care and Share is being planned for upcoming Sundays. Session and Ladies' Bible Study are hosting so far. The Almira Holcombe Scholarships will be given out to Julia A., Dillon G., Stephen M., and Marcus R., they are our graduating Senior's this year. The scholarships will be given out later in May. On Memorial Day Sunday, is the last Sunday for Adult and Children's Sunday School until the fall.

Pat will get carnations for the women on Mother's Day. Sue contacted Gabe Stephens from SHR and some of the Marching Band will come and play special music for our 5/26 service. Our last service for 10:30 am until September is June 2nd. We will be starting the summer schedule on Sunday June 9th, and the worship service will be at 9:30 am. The last Session Business Meeting until September is Monday June 10th. There are no Session Business Meeting during July and August. More on the summer prayer meetings to follow.

New Copy Machine- Was received from Prior-Nami, and is a Canon Image Runner Advance. Sue will go ahead and pay them. The new machine is working out well.

Worship and Music/Church Life - Joanne DiBlasi/Karen Thatcher

Insurance Review- Karen- We are still with the Duryea Agency and Franklin Mutual Insurance.

Young Adult Time- Same as last month. Whoever is preaching and if they aren't giving the young adult time, then Joanne will look into getting someone.

Soup Sale and other Fund Raisers- The soup sales have made over \$3000. Sight and Sound was talked about and how the church will be attending "Noah" for 2025. Karen will be assisting LaNelle to work out the details. Other fundraisers could be to fund the DR trip and different Ladies' and Mens' retreats. The Deacons and Fish Pond will be asking for donations at the Shad Fest. This year's Fish Pond monies will be going back to our church for the construction of the new church roof.

Accompanist/Music Director- We are blessed to have the Brass Ensemble, organ, saxophone, keyboard and vocals. Karen has done a post on Facebook to the Liturgical Musicians page, and we had gotten a response. Adri will be coming to our service on May 5th to see what our church is about and hopefully she'll be put on the rotating Accompanist's list. Our resume for the Accompanist/Music Director is still active on "Call Finders" the Presbytery Website.

Spanish Ministry- Joanne has been in touch with Francesca regarding the Spanish Community to rent our Chapel on Wednesday nights. This was approved by Session. The Spanish Ministry will be starting in the Chapel this coming week at 7:00 pm. Joanne will be staying on at this time, to see how things would be going.

Easter Breakfast on 3/31- Don talked about the breakfast, and said the Deacons did a great job. Session agreed.

Building and Grounds – Pat Durborow/Phil McCloughan/Heather McIntyre/Don Pidcock

The **new technology** for the Livestream is up and running. Phil suggested that we buy 2 or 4 more microphones for the front of the church, so that the people that are playing can be heard better. A lot of the kinks were narrowed down.

Martinez Landscaping- Cleaned up the church grounds. Heather will take care of paying the bill.

Church Roof- This is ongoing, and Heather and Phil will narrow it down to one contractor. There are 2 possibilities at the moment. Don asked if we should fundraise by reaching out to the community. Maybe have "Reel to Real" come back to do a fundraiser for the new roof. Phil talked about the painting to be done to the outside of the church, possibly, at the same time the roof is being done. Finkle's billed the church for fixing the gutter guards on the back of the church. Nate will look at the trees in the back of the church to see how it is presenting a problem for the gutters. Water is going into Finkel's basement. Heather will look into why they billed us. **Roof of Westminster House-** Gutter is coming off, and Nate to look at this as well.

Skating and Friday Night Hang – Skating ended for the season in March. Jen and Steve Chernoski will be overseeing the skating for next season. Friday Night Hang will not be continued next season as of now.

Church Organ- Was discussed under the calendar portion of the meeting.

Hallway in Church/Bathrooms- The church hallway Joanne talked about washing and painting the walls. The bathrooms were not discussed tonight.

Heating in the Church/Westminster House- Nothing on the insurance claim regarding the heaters. Pat asked Sue to call Tilly to come and service the fire extinguishers, and SDG for the yearly Alarm Test. The reports are to be sent to Frank Ur the Lambertville Fire Inspector.

Almire Holcombe Scholarship-This was discussed during the calendar portion of the meeting. Don added that care packages get sent to our young adults who are in college from the Deacons.

Pastor Search Committee- The "Turn the Page" handouts were given to the Session Members to be reviewed in order to proceed with the pastor search. Session will talk to the congregation to see what kind of pastor that we would be looking for. Session would like to reach out to Mt. Airy Pres. to see if sharing a pastor would be the way to go, especially for both services. Don asked Pastor Linda if we will need to have a Presbyterian Minister, or if they can be from another domination. The pastor that we get, has to have the same polity that our Presbytery has. More people are getting certificates to be a lay pastor, instead of going into Seminary. This is happening mostly in the mid and southwest. It may become a trend here as well. Linda said that people aren't going into Seminary as much as in previous years. She did suggest that we keep an open mind and to talk to Mt. Airy about sharing a pastor, and that small churches should stick together.

Shad Fest- Don mentions that the Deacons will be giving out religious books and bibles out for the youth that come to the Deacon Table at Shad Fest.

Budget and Finance – Heather McIntyre

Our Year-to-Date Summary was given out and was discussed, from 1/1-4/15/24, and we are under in our Plate by \$530.68 and Heather reviewed this with Session. We can use Subsplash for fundraising if needed, for they wouldn't charge us. Phil mentions that maybe we can post hymns on YouTube while people are watching. We can possibly look at this at a later time.

Lowell Hunter Estate- No updates at this time.

Boy Scouts- No updates at this time.

Usage of the Gym for LPS during the 2023-2024 School Year- We have been paid up to date for the use of the gym. Heather will reach out to Jim if another check isn't received by the end of the school year.

Heating System Energy Assessment- On pause for now, but Heather will keep session updated with any new developments.

Grants-Were not discussed at this time.

Per Capita- Money was moved to Missions in December. Session would like to find out more information from the Presbytery regarding their stances on various issues, before our church funds the Presbytery's Per Capita. Joanne talked about our Per Capita funds our missionaries, and that they are doing God's work, and we should keep things as is, but Session will pray on this and will revisit.

Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of the Highlands- Phil attended the Zoom meeting on 3/12/24, and brought a report back to Session. At the meeting, it was discussed to pull their money out of fossil fuels and to put it into something else-ex: Green Energy. The Presbytery seems to be getting more into social issues, so Phil listened. It seemed to be more about social issues than God's word. There is another Stated Meeting on May 14, which Phil will be attending on Zoom.

Sunday School/Junior Deacons – Joanne DiBlasi/Don Pidcock

Sunday School- Is still continuing. Don let Sue know that Sunday School will be ending in May.

Junior Deacons- The Jr. Deacons will be participating in Shad Fest. LaNelle Gallagher is looking to put together a group of Jr. Deacons to carry out a whole service in the future. More details to follow.

Missions – Joanne DiBlasi

Mission checks have gone out. No further updates at this time.


