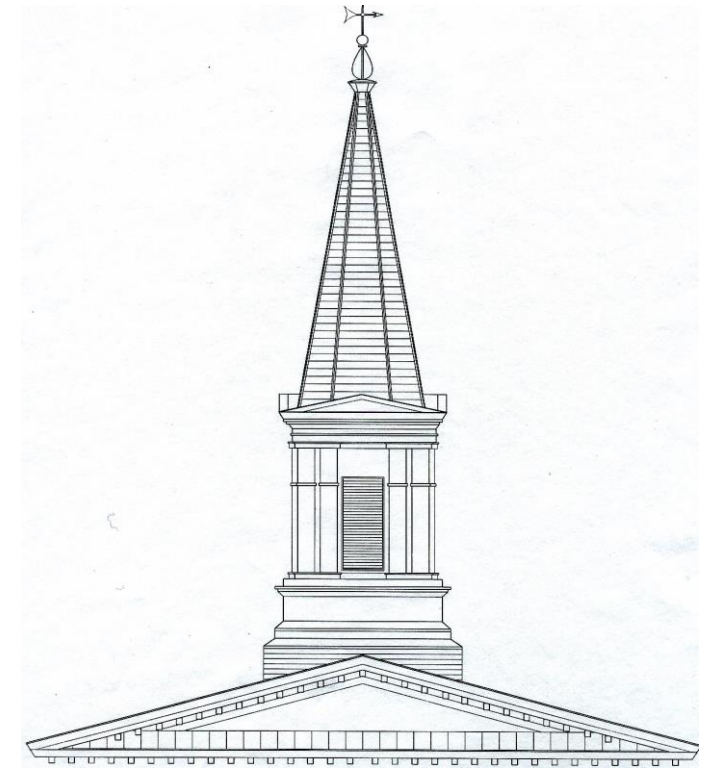

Hymn Time:

“Rock of Ages” Augustus M. Toplady (1740-1778)

The writing of Rock of Ages by the Reverend Augustus M. Toplady, an English Vicar in 1775, is one of the strangest stories in the history of hymns. The words, “Rock of ages, cleft for me, Let me hide myself in Thee; Let the water and the blood, From Thy riven side which flowed, Be of sin the double cure, Clense from wrath and make me pure,” were first written on the back side of a playing card, the six of diamonds.

It came about one day when Toplady was walking some distance from his home and was caught in a sudden, violent storm. There was no shelter nearby, but the Vicar spied a huge cleft running down a ledge beside the road. He took refuge here and was protected from the storm. He thought, while there, of the spiritual significance of his experience. God is a refuge from the storms of life.

Reaching down to the ground, he picked up a playing card, which he found lying there, and upon this surface, the famous words were penned:

*Rock of Ages, cleft for me, Let me hide myself in Thee;
Let the water and the blood, From Thy wounded side which flowed,
Be of Sin the double cure, Save from wrath and make me pure.*
